We ask the TRI-V Family to remember in your prayers Beverly Schneider, aunt of Bev Lardin. She suffered a stroke on September 20th at her home in Indiana. She is now at home slowly recovering and still having some issues. Bev and Mike have gone down to assist the family every other weekend. While they were gone Grandma Judy ended watching Alyssa for the weekend. Judy has survived each weekend and is still able to keep up with Alyssa. Judy and John Lardin will be leaving on Wednesday, October 12th, for Corpus Christi Texas to celebrate granddaughters Christine seventh birthday. They will return on Monday, October 17th. John and Larry are hoping to get in one round of golf. With the weather and Larry's work schedule they have not been able to play golf for almost two years. With their return from Texas there is talk of them making another trip to Illinois to visit her Mom. Judy does not want to fly so John suggested that perhaps Judy might drive down on Saturday or Sunday, October 22nd or 23rd and John to fly down on Tuesday or Wednesday. They told him to quit smoking and less caffeine (too much coffee and Mountain Dew). They thought it could be stress or anxiety. He is to follow up with a visit to his primary physician. Mike will probably be upset with Dad for sharing this with you but he could use some prayers, as we all could at one time or another. Mike did put a scare into Mom and Dad but they are overjoyed of the results.

We are also asked to remember those less fortunate who were suffering and recovering from various ills. Club members mourned the passing of Veda Henry, wife of original member Jack, from a brain aneurysm. Peggy Burd was hospitalized for seven weeks with a type of pulmonary fibrosis and was on oxygen support for 24 hours a day. Nick Angelosanto had another nerve block done3 on his back at Providence Pain Center in hope of some relief from the pain he has been suffering for several years. Dave Ruetenik had his rotator cuff shoulder surgery and came home feeling really the best he has in a long time. Last but not least Peg Hoffman was home recovering from her successful hip replacement. There was an article updating us on Becky and Julie Clingerman, daughters of John and Donna Clingerman, on their schooling (Becky) and Peace Corps duties in Ecuador (Julie). Glenn and Marge Stock spent most of August in Tennessee with family while Pat and Lou Koewler spent time in Minneapolis visiting family. Vickie Battel, mother of Vickie Angelosanto, returned to Arizona after spending the summer with Nick and Vickie. John Mackson along with teaching at Taylor Schools is an assistant basketball coach at Oakland Community College, Orchard Lake Campus, Vickie Angelosanto, Annemarie Angelosanto and Madeline (Anne's Mom) were selected to have their vehicle inspected on their return from Canada. John Lardin had both knees replaced and was up sitting in a chair that afternoon following surgery. Two days later they had him walking with a walker and the following day had him going up one and down one step. Art Trachsel's stepson, Ron Doebler, was diagnosed with shingles the day before his oldest daughter gave birth to his first granddaughter and Art's second great granddaughter. Kaylie Snow, granddaughter of Jack and Jacqui Schaefer, and Christine Lardin, granddaughter of John and Judy Lardin, were both hit by a car in the same week. Kaylie was hit at the Meijer parking lot and Christine was hit by a car that jumped the curb, hit a stop sign then left the scene. Fortunately both the girls were not seriously hurt. Other news shared was Cy and Dorothy Richeson attending the wedding of their granddaughter in Brighton, Mike Lardin successfully passed the certification test for Low Pressure Boiler Operator for the Plymouth-Canton Schools, Judy and John Lardin, George and Peg Hoffman, Jack Schaefer and John's brother-in-law spent a couple of days in Indiana, site of final golf, playing some golf, Ken and Diane Plocharczyk in the process of buying a lake front lot in Sugar Springs development near West Branch and John and Judy Lardin spending a week in Texas visiting Larry and family. While Bill and Shirley Suchner were headed to Lorton VA and the Amtrak Auto Train to take them and their car to Florida the end of October Vickie Battel, mother of Vickie Angelosanto remained in Michigan braving the cooler temperatures. Vickie's sister, Marihelen, is coming to Michigan the day after Thanksgiving for the weekend and takes Mom back with her to Arizona. Dennis and Marlene Wutka spend a week in Branson MO with 57 others from the Redford Seniors. John Mackson has been promoted to head coach of the boy's varsity basketball team at Kennedy High School in Taylor. Final Golf was held at Kendallville In with 29 members and two guests attending the weekend. There was an article with final cost for the 70th TRI-V Club Anniversary Party to be held at McGuire's Resort in Cadillac Mi the weekend of June 23, 2007. This brings us to the end of another trip down memory lane. Thinking back to final golf in 2001, Nick Angelosanto had to pull out of golf because his back was acting up and Lee Anderson also had to pull out of Sunday as he came down with something on Saturday night and could not play. Ten years later, unfortunately, Nick still has some problems with his back.
