- Assembling puzzles with Trey and hearing him say, "Good job pa".
- Picking up Ea after school and riding the bus home with her. Guess who carried her oversized backpack.
- Watching Harry Potter with Ea and Trey. As much as they tried to explain it to me, I just didn't get it.
- Watching the Tigger Movie at least five times. That one I got! Your friends can be like your family. Who are the Poohs, the Eeyores, the Rabbits, the Owls, the Piglets, and the Roos in your lives?
