Proposed by-law change.

Tri-V members. I would like to propose the following by-law change at our October Meeting. Below I have listed the original language and the proposed changes to Section 3 #2 by-law.

(ORIGINAL LANGUAGE) Section 3. (Vice President)

2. The Vice-President shall appoint a emergency calling system comprised of members of the council and an alternate. The purpose of the calling system is to notify the membership in case of the death of a Club member or a member of his immediate family. The immediate family is defined as spouse, parent, brother, sister, child, or parent of spouse. The membership should also be notified of the illness of a member or his spouse that require hospitalization expected to exceed 48 hours. If the President and Vice-President cannot be reached, Club members who have information involving the above circumstances shall notify any Council Member.

(PROPOSED CHANGE) Section 3. (Vice President)

2. The Vice-President shall appoint a emergency <u>notification</u> system comprised of members of the council and an alternate. The purpose of the <u>notification</u> system is to <u>inform</u> the membership in case of the death of a Club member or a member of his immediate family. The immediate family is defined as spouse, parent, brother, sister, child, or parent of spouse. The membership should also be notified of

the illness of a member or his spouse that requires hospitalization expected to exceed 48 hours. If the President and Vice-President cannot be reached, Club members who have information involving the above circumstances shall notify any Council Member.

In order to change a by-law the changes must be proposed at meeting and will then be voted on at the following meeting (Article 7 section 2). Please feel free to contact me <u>trach1s@hotmail.com</u> or (586)850-0161 if you have questions or comments you would like addressed at Octobers meeting.
